CCMTA receives its mandate from, and reports to, the Council of Ministers Responsible for Transportation and Highway Safety.

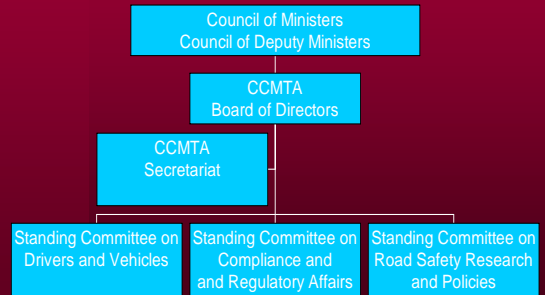
Vision

Structure



Secretariat

The association is supported by a Secretariat in Ottawa which coordinates and manages the business of the organization, standing committees and Board of Directors, including various national programs (e.g.: IRE, NAFTA)

Approximately 170 organizations are associate members

Responsibilities

Harmonization, uniformity, best practices, policies and regulations for:

- highway safety
- drivers
- vehicles
- motor carriers

Standing Committees

- Each jurisdiction represented
- 2 meetings per year
- Meetings open since 1994

Project Groups

CCMTA has approximately 50 project groups which report to one of the three standing committees or the Board of Directors.

Project Groups

- Specific mandate
- Usually small 3 to 6 people
- Members from Gov. and Industry
- Report to Standing Committee

NVIS Project Group

- Project Group since 2003
- 6 Government members
ON, QC, BC, AB, MB, PE, TC
- Industry Members CVMA, AIAMC, MMIC, CTEA
- Reports to D&V Standing Committee

Origin of NVIS Project Group

- New NVIS forms appeared from industry by PDF file. Gov. did not know how to react?
- Other issues regarding insufficient space on form (multi-stage manufacturing)
- Process-standard unchanged for 20 years

Objectives (mandate)

- To carry out research into the NVIS process
- To identify current business practices
- To address other short comings with the current NVIS form.
- To explore possible electronic NVIS practices

NVIS Timelines

June 2003 - Project Group approved
Oct 2003 - Survey of jurisdictions and practice
May 2004 - CCMTA Board approves concept
Sept 2004 - Gov – Industry session
May 2005 - Preliminary Standard
June 2005 - Group meets to address industry and gov. issues

NVIS Timelines

2005 - ON-DC Pilot
Dec 2005 - Preliminary Std. approved by Board
Mar 2006 - Fraud Issue resolved
Sept 2006 - Meeting with industry
Dec 2006 - Final CCMTA Board approval
2007+ - Implementation
