Background

- 5 Jurisdictional Surveys (Sept 2016 Sept 2018)
- Provide current, reliable and valid estimate of prevalence of alcohol and drug use by drivers
- Provide information on temporal, geographic and demographic characteristics of those involved
- Together, can be used to establish a baseline of cannabis use by drivers prior to legalization




Oral Fluid

Quantisal oral fluid collection kit □ 2 minutes to collect 1mL OF Sent by courier to lab Screened with immunoassay; confirmed by LC/MS-MS measures recent use parent drug vs metabolites □ \$10 Gift Card







Age Distribution




BAC Distribution




Cannabis = 74% of all drugs


• Alc/Drug or Both= 12.9%

 Among Drinking Drivers, 20% also positive for Drugs


Drug Use by Drivers (BC 2010 – 2018)




Alcohol and THC Positive Drivers According to Age Group




Alcohol and THC Positive Drivers According to Age Group (ON 2017)




Drug Use by Age Group BC (2012 & 2018)




Alcohol and THC Positive <u>Novice</u> Drivers According to Age Group




Alcohol and THC Positive Drivers According to Survey Night



Alcohol and THC Positive Drivers According to Survey Time







What did we learn?

- Alcohol decreased dramatically
- Cannabis more common than alcohol among drivers increasing
- □ Younger drivers 19-25
- Older Novice drivers (19-25)
- Not just weekends
- Late night
- Groups of younger males



Final Word

Need to re-assess in 2-3 years to determine impact of legalization
